## HOW TO FIND A LITERARY AGENT

1. ***Publisher's Weekly***: A weekly magazine that details new deals from well known agents, along with other pertinent information about publishing in general.
2. ***Literary Marketplace***: A book that includes lists of literary agents with their preferred genres, and often submission guidelines.
3. ***Publisher's Marketplace***: A website with information about publishing and new deals.

4. ***Shaw's Guide to Writers Conferences***: Online international guide to writers' conferences throughout the world.

6. **Recommendations from Jan Kardys' list of agents** at Unicorn Writers' Conference.
7. Acknowledgement pages in books which often mentioning the agent's name.
8. Recommendations from published authors (Book signings are excellent places to meet published authors)
9. Books in bookstores and libraries that are the same genre as your book; call the Contracts Department or Permission Department for that book's publisher and ask who the agent is for the book.
